Welcome back to Mission Kid!

Let's review what we have learned so far...

What country are we learning about? **Liberia!**

Who is an orphan? **Someone without a mom and dad.**

Where do orphans live in Liberia? **An orphanage.**

What is the special place orphans in Liberia can attend to learn skills and about God's Word? **REAP Camp**

Great job!

Today we're going to meet another orphan in Liberia. Her name is Victoria and she's learning about cooking and hospitality at camp.

Who knows what hospitality means?

[Time for kids to answer]

Those are some great answers! Showing hospitality can mean many different things – like sharing a meal in your home, offering to help someone else with a task like mowing the lawn, sending a card to someone sick at home, or selling cookies to raise funds for orphans.

For Victoria, she's learning to cook and bake so she can show hospitality to those around her, and so that she can be prepared to find a job when she is an adult. She likes to make cinnamon rolls. Who here likes to eat cinnamon rolls?

[Time for kids to raise hands]

Sometimes it's not always easy to show hospitality though. Sometimes it costs us our comfort or time, or even money. But whatever we do, big or small, God just wants us to show His love by showing hospitality.

He says in First Peter 4:9, "Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling."

What's a time that you showed hospitality to someone and it wasn't easy?

[Time for kids to answer]

Thank you for sharing!

Today let's pray for Victoria, and the other kids at camp as they learn new skills and learn how to share hospitality with those around them. Let's also pray for us – that we are willing to do what God calls us to do, even when it isn't the easiest thing.

Day 3 Activity Options

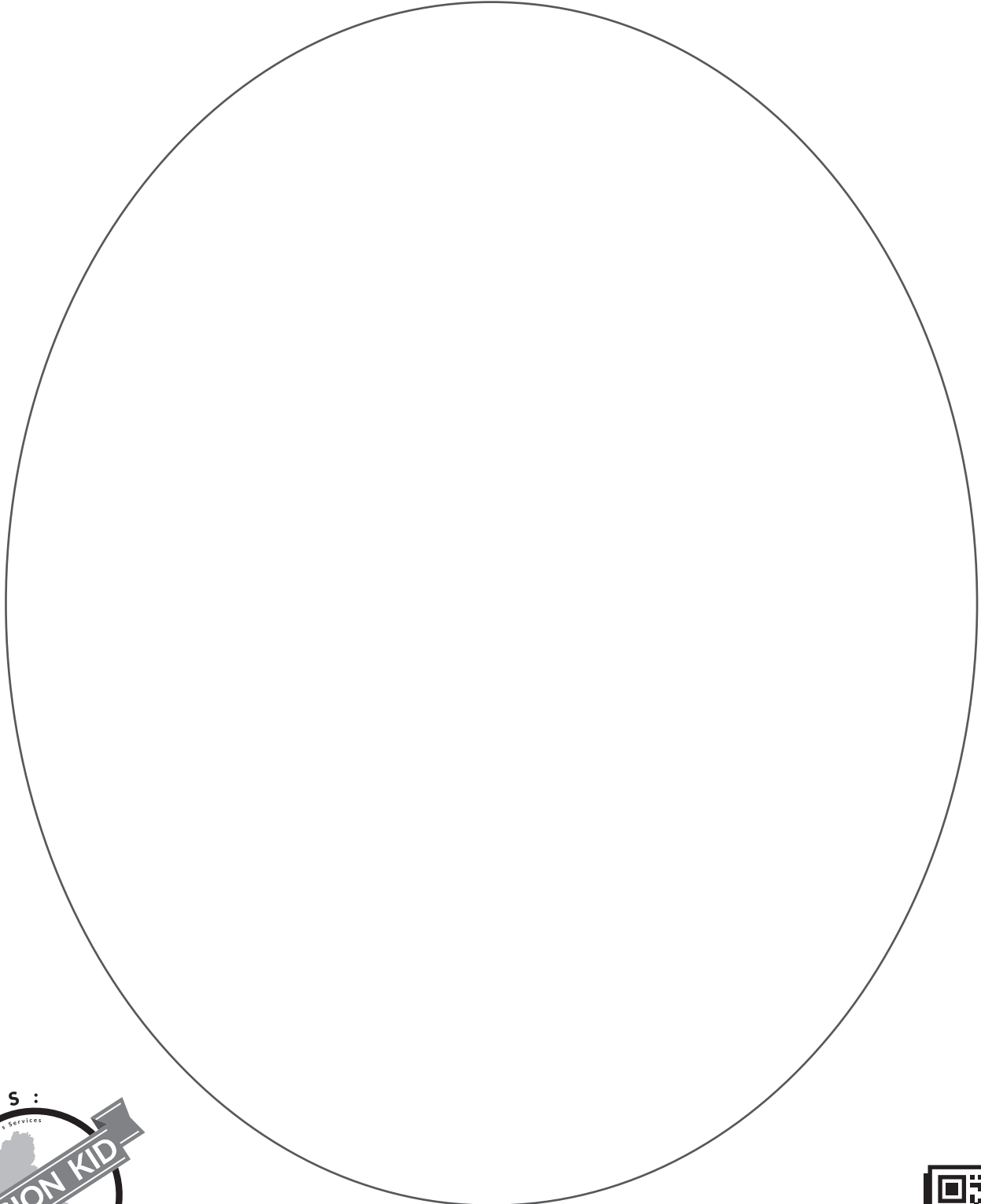
1) Individual Option – Victoria Page

- Give each child a piece of paper with a circle on it and crayons (see the last page of this lesson). Have them use the circle to create Victoria's face. They can draw her picture and then write things around the picture about things they learned about her (example: cinnamon rolls, hospitality, cooking). They can also write down ways they will pray for her.

2) Group Option – REAP Prayer Banner

- On a roll of paper, write "REAP" in very large letters. Make it long enough for each child to have a place to sit around the paper. Let each child write or draw something they learned about REAP (it teaches kids about God, it teaches farming, it teaches sewing, provides food, provides a safe place to stay). Then, hang it up in your area so the kids can remember all the things about REAP and ways to pray for the kids who attend the camp.
